OVERVIEW

With the evolving strategies for locoregional management of early-stage breast cancer, the decisions to de-escalate surgery and when to omit axillary lymph node dissection (ALND) and/or sentinel lymph node biopsy (SLNB) and to select the appropriate radiation therapy (RT) dosing should always involve shared decision-making between the patient and clinician, considering the specific tumor biology, other clinical features, and the potential impact on adjuvant systemic therapy decisions. Using a case-based approach can be beneficial to understand the de-escalation approaches in surgery and radiation treatment.
